

ICGBV Membership Criteria

Full Membership Criteria

Organisations are eligible to join the ICGBV as full members if they;

- Are an INGO or statutory agency working in international humanitarian and development contexts, Registered in Ireland
- Are concerned about gender based violence, as well as having a gender focus within their organisation
- Are a University/academic institute with a focus on International humanitarian and development practice, looking to further their knowledge, understanding and practices around GBV issues
- Comply with the ICGBV charter for ending GBV
- Comply with the annual subscriptions payments (Less than 2 million Gross Income = €1000/year; 2-4 Million = €2,500/Year; 4 million Plus = €3,500)

Full membership allows organisations decision making authority to the planning and workings of the ICGBV (Annual CEO Meetings; Strategic Planning and Steering Committee meetings; representation at international policy fora) as well as the learning, practice and other working group structures.

Associate Membership Criteria

Organisations are eligible to join the ICGBV as associate members if they;

- Are concerned about Gender Based Violence, and have a gender focus within their organisation
- Comply with the ICGBV charter for ending GBV
- An NGO or statutory agency working to address GBV within Ireland, especially those working with Diaspora communities
- Comply with the annual subscriptions payment of €500

Associate Membership offers organisations access to the shared networking, learning and practice activities of the Consortium. This includes full membership of the working groups, and guest/contributory attendance in the steering committee. However it does not offer decision making participation in the strategic planning process and workings of the Consortium.

Please note that an organisation that fulfils the criteria for full membership cannot apply for associate membership¹. Membership approval for either Full or Associate membership will be made following review of a submitted application by the Steering Committee.

¹ Such Organisations could include: Irish civil society and NGOs whose work focuses on support Diaspora communities with a gendered perspective or Irish Civil Society and NGOs working to address GBV in Ireland
